



Warriors: Power of Three: Outcast (\$6.99, HarperCollins, 2009) continues the saga of Firestar's descendents Hollypaw, Jaypaw and Lionpaw. The Warrior series captivates readers as young as 10 years old with tales of animal heroes, romance and surprises. In this third book, Firestar's grandchildren progress through their warrior training

and are destined to hold more power than any cat before them. Only Jaypaw understands the importance of delving into the felines' past to find answers to their future. Author Erin Hunter lives in



the United Kingdom and is inspired by her love of cats.

Give yourself or your youngster a brain-tease; pick up any of the Pocket Posh series of books featuring Sudoku 3, Word Search 2, Logic and Crosswords (\$7.99, Andrews McMeel Publishing). These purse-sized books are encased in

stylish covers and contain 75 to 100 puzzles each. The Sudoku book has three levels of difficulty (easy, medium, difficult) that even challenge a 10-yearold. Just tuck one of these



in your beach bag or purse for a brain workout anywhere you go.

Tickle your kids' fancy with tunes by Grammy-winning singer Ziggy Marley whose CD Family Time (\$12.98, Tuff Gong Worldwide, 2009) was inspired by his own two young children. The reggae album features the music of Marley's

family and friends, including Paul Simon and Willie Nelson. Actress Jamie Lee Curtis also narrates



two stories on the CD. "Ziggy Says," a musical rendition of "Simon Says," is an example of Marley's mantra of "put a smile on your face and make the sign of peace." Also available for download. www.ziggymarley.com

For the younger set, ages 2 to 8, consider the music of Gustafer Yellowgold's Mellow Fever (\$19.99, Apple-Eye Productions, 2009). This CD/ DVD set features a quirky sunsational character whose catchy melodies are

accompanied by hand-drawn characters and settings.


This album combines melodies. animated illustrations and the words to go along with each selection. This is the third in a series of musical sets created by award-winning

Finally for some fun mom reading, pick up I'd Trade my Husband for a Housekeeper (\$18.95, Chronicle Books, 2009), which examines the challenges of parenthood. Through interviews

with hundreds of mothers. authors Trisha Ashworth and Amy Nobile tackle the quandary faced by married couples today: loving your marriage as much as you do your husband



and kids. Among the thought-provoking tidbits are suggestions on ways to have a happy marriage. "You have to be happy yourself," the book states.
